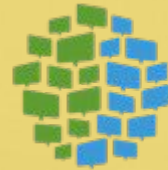

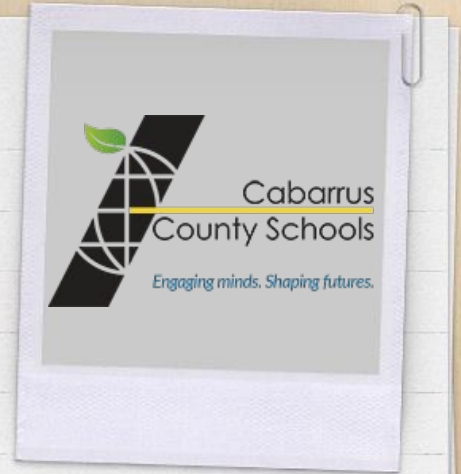

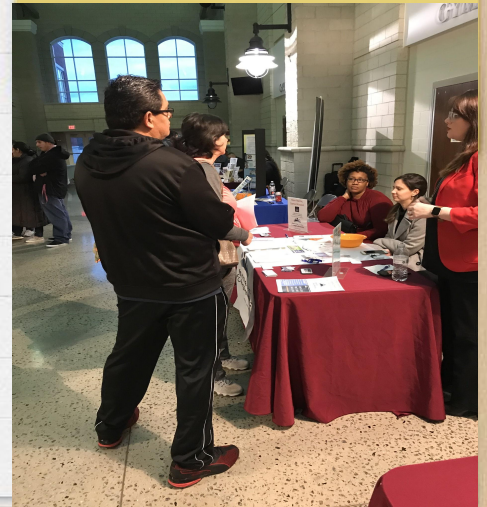

“Cultural responsiveness is the ability to learn from and relate respectfully with people of your own culture as well as those from other cultures.”

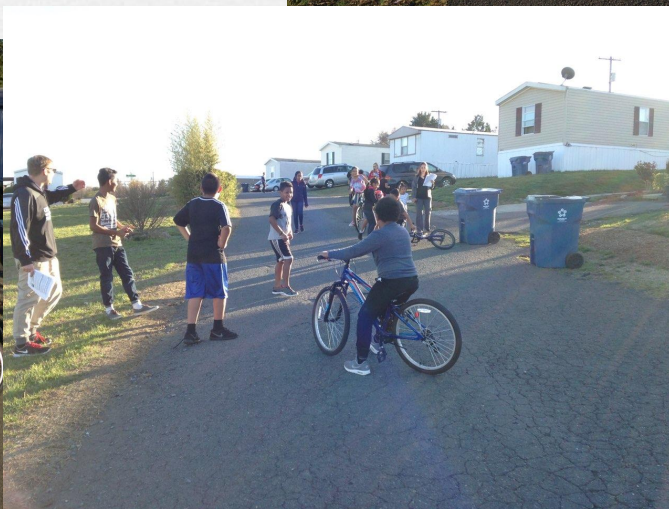
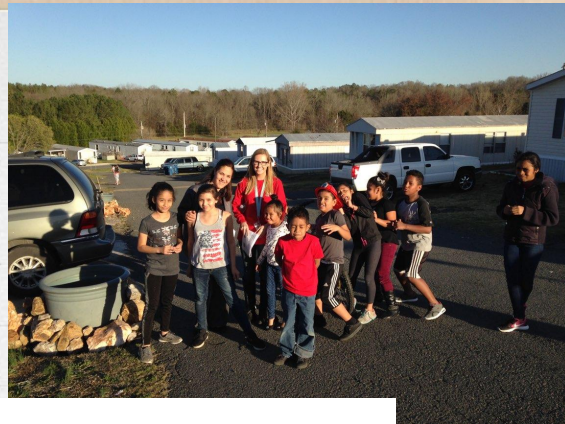

- 5. Foster Community by Building Social Capital**

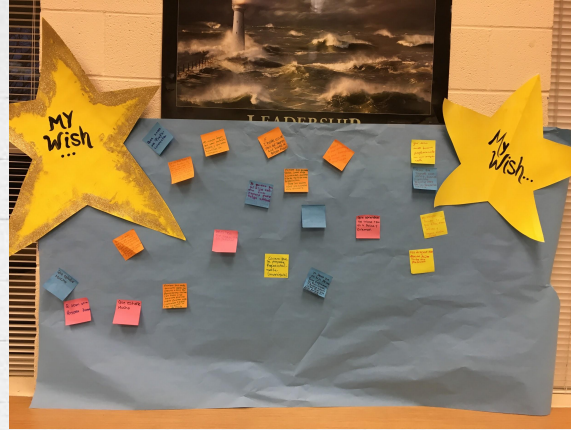

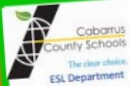

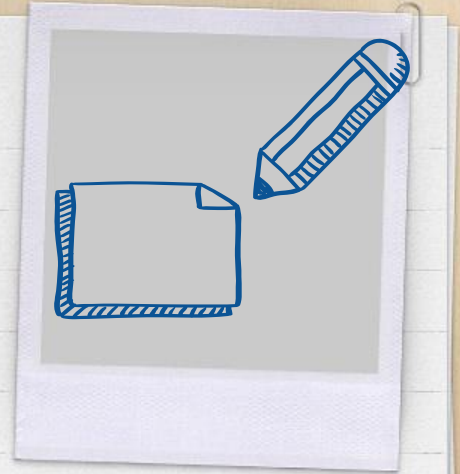
